Paul Stadler was the successful coordinator for 2 Comenius projects and 2 Erasmus+ projects, he is the founder of the youth art association "Art&Development", he is organizer for international "woodcut and land art symposias" in Austria and he is Juror for art competitions. "From my experience, jointly developed art connects people in their feelings and generates understanding for each other."(Paul Stadler) On 2009 The Council of the European Union adopted a new strategic framework for European cooperation in education and training ("ET 2020) In its third strategic objective "Promoting equity, social cohesion and active citizenship", the Council stresses that "all citizens....should be encouraged to further education, active citizenship and inter cultural dialogue". Considering this important goal, we would like to help schools to work towards key competencies; to work on acquiring of knowledge about their identity and accepting other people as friends and partners; to develop their emotional intelligence to fully participate in society of knowledge. Our experience shows that having competencies only in the field of science is not enough to live together in harmony. It is necessary to share common European values in art and culture. We have a team with about 5 teachers responsible for Erasmus+ projects in school, we have a permanent exhibition about ongoing Erasmus+ projects (panoramic picture, art aula - arena), we have a pupils's core team for Erasmus+ and we found a special subject in school called "Modul Erasmus+" with Curriculum.

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The Istituto d'Istruzione Superiore M.Pagano in Campobasso is the oldest school of Molise region. It was founded in 1816 by the king of Naples, Ferdinand IV and eleveted to the rank of High School in May 1857. In 1865, after the unification of Italy it was called "Regio Liceo Mario Pagano" and since then, its educational programme has been addressed to humanities. Each of the two departments, according to their specific expertise: scientific and artistic education, has contributed to enrich the Liceo Classico M.Pagano in its training offer, assuring students the best basic education and a chance to realize their own inclinations with a care for their growth and human formation. The school M.Pagano in Campobasso has then incorporated a variety of competences and experiences and implemented harmonious curricula. The whole school has 806 students, 83 teachers, a school headmaster and 22 employees (secretarial and administration field). The school has a library with 14,000 volumes of historical interest to the students and it is equipped with all the technical, IT devices and logistics (including an auditorium with 360 seats) to provide educational courses, training programmes and other complementary activities. The Organization priorities aim to train students in every educational field, leading them to the study of artistic phenomena and artistic production and humanities, furnishing continuous cross-curricular training. Students during the five year course increase their awareness of their Artistic Heritage in its historical and cultural context and fully appreciate its presence and value in today's society. The Liceo Artistico Manzù boasts a variety of activities and design experiences since its participation to local and National art contests and European projects is part of its dynamic presence on the territory. In the past some classes of the Liceo Artistico were involved in European projects relating the safeguard of Cultural Heritage from natural disasters risks, and presevation of hand-written Heritage, entrusting the school with the graphic design of comics ("Les Jeunes de Noé", Interreg IIIC; "Chindeu", cooperation with third countries India and China). In 2011 the school, which at the time was a department of the high school ITAS "Pertini" in Campobasso, joined the EU programme LLP being partner in the Comenius Multilateral project "Supporting Intercultural Education through Museums: Think, Talk, Touch", to support non-formal education in the framework of school-museums cooperation within 7 European countries and arise students' active participation to European citizenship. The Instituto de Enseñanza Secundaria Villa de Vícar is a public Secondary School (12-18 years old students), created in 2000 and located in Vícar, Almería, Spain. The school has got 55 teachers and 621 students of 19 different nationalities, divided in 23 groups. Over 22% of our students have nationalities other than Spanish. The School is located in an area of fast economic development. The main economic activity is intensive agriculture. Most of the population around are newcomers who have arrived over the last 40 years from both other areas of Spain and overseas. Our School is involved in a number of programmes and projects promoted by the regional education authority in Andalusia, some of them listed here: Gender equality; ICT schools; School coexistence; School: space for peace. Our school has been awarded for this last mentioned programme by the regional education authority for the last five years. The School has also cooperated with the local Town Council in the application for the UNICEF Child Friendly Cities recognition that has been successfully granted in 2014. The regional education office has included our School in the Bilingual programme (Spanish-English) which is being implemented from 2016-2017 school year. Our School is yearly evaluated by the AGAEVE -the regional evaluation agency in Andalusia- since the School takes part in the "Quality and improvement of results" programme. A large amount of our teachers are involved in long life training programmes and some of them have experience in tutoring courses for other teachers. Over the last three years different teachers' groups have been specifically working on key competences implementation. One of our major concerns is working on motivation and employment guidance. We aim at decreasing our rate of early school leaving (currently about 20%) trying to provide our students with motivations and expectations about their future, broadening the range of possibilities for their employability. Antonio Luis Pelegrín Pradas (contact person) is a teacher of Spanish and Head of the Department of Spanish. He has got experience as coordinator of gender equality and cross-cultural school programmes, as well as manager of extra academic activities. He took part in the Comenius project mentioned above. The Nagy Lajos Secondary School of the Cistercian Order (Ciszterci Rend Nagy Lajos Gimnáziuma) in Pécs is one of Hungary's oldest schools founded by the Jesuits in 1687. We have 750 students between 13-19 and 65 teachers. There are specialized classes: one in biology and chemistry, one in maths and information technology, another one in English and German. Our previous and current international educational projects (Comenius and Erasmus+) have motivated us to develop the acquired experience with new partners on a new topic. The school's ethnography spesialized class, the colorful palette of school extra-curricural activities, the diverse, open and active class of students are a solid foundation for the project. The traditional character of the school is reflected in the regular (curricular), student-oriented work around the school's farmhouse, in horse-archery activity, in the decisive character of school celebrations (commemoration of historical, folk and religious occasions). Many of the school activities are enriched by art camps, astronomy circles and the Orff school orchestra band, which can add a lot to the art-tales-mythology project. The teaching staff consists of motivated, creative, professionally demanding and wide-ranging teachers close to the interdisciplinary approach and the need for professional renewal. Pécs is a border town, our students derive from the region, some of them from multinational settlements, which gives rise to cultural dialogue (Croats, Swabians, ...). This is a good basis for the openness toward the partner nations in the similarities and differences of their motifs. Zsolnay porcelain (famous trademark of Pécs) manufacure's products represent the harmonic combination of traditional and modern motifs. Our project coordination team comprises of four people who is in charge of implementing, monitoring and evaluating the activities. The members of the team: the financial leader of the institution, the project contact person (Péter Andrásfalvy), an administrative teacher (Katalin Raics) and a teacher responsible for the professional implementation (Tamás Nádudvary). Tamás Nádudvary (English, French and Italian teacher) and Péter Andrásfalvy (history and English teacher) are teachers with experience in leading international projects; prepeared and coordinated a Comenius and an Erasmus + project; Katalin Raics (teacher of physics, biology and environmental studies) who previously worked as a researcher, university lecturer and has teaching experience in the English and German programme at the Medical School (University of Pécs). Katalin organizes experimental activities, scientific projects for students; is active in interdisciplinar fields and has teaching methodology publications. Tamás Nádudvary applies innovative teaching methods in linguistic fields.

Being the only artistic school in Arad County, the students collective is particularly diverse. At our school there are studying both students from the city Arad and pupils from the towns and villages in the county. The teaching staff of the school comprises 149 teachers. 80% are professors specialized in artistic education. There are 20 visual art teachers. Our school aims to provide students with an education that meets their training needs, to develop extracurricular activities that complement the education received during the classes. We need successful international models offered by the education institutions that have experience in this field. "Sabin Dragoi" College of Arts Arad already has extensive experience in the development and implementation of European projects, with several projects in the lifelong learning program - Comenius projects, Grundtvig projects, Leonardo da Vinci projects, a Phare CBC project, Erasmus Plus projects, but also other projects funded by the Brithish Council, by the local budget or by NGOs. The sculpture and ceramics department has 4 studios where pupils learn the basics of modelling in clay and 3D art works of art. There are also one ceramics oven and 3 potter's wheels. For this project we hope to look into primitive and archaic art and find its connection with modern and contemporary art using art history and storytelling for discovering the connection between our world and the lost worlds of Europe. Trough the international exchange of experience with other students we hope that our students will gain a European conscience, develop their communication skills, develop their imagination and creativity and learn more about the history of Europe. Moldovan Cosmin-Florin is an artist and sculpture teacher. He has a master and PHD in contemporary sculpture. At the moment he is the coordinator of the visual arts department of the school. cosminmoldovan.ro. Tugulea Ioana is teacher of Art History since 2001 at our school. During these years her pupils won numerous national awards. She has a PHD in Art History. At the beginning of each Erasmus + project, an official team of teachers is established that will be involved till the end of the project. If one members leaves the group another will enter.

European ART & TALES in progress (ART & TALES)

Once upon a time there were ancient civilisations in EUROPE – paintings in caves, sculptures in the stone age, Greek mythology about the origin of Europe, ...

Our project ART &TALES will be created by six European Countries with the oldest art history in Europe (for instance Spain with Altamira, Italy with Etrusce and Roman culture, very old caves in Bulgaria, sculptures from stone age in Austria - venus from Willendorf) and a lot of European cultural heritage, tales and mythology in all partner countries. Also in the project are 2 schools with a special focus in art (Romania and Italy) and schools with focus in history, writing and schools with focus on languages, also old languages (Greek and Latin). The project focuses on the beginning of European history and mythology in art, mythology and tales and acquires skills in creating art and writing tales - comparable to a huge picture book.

To our opinion comes the value and the understanding of the beginnings of European cultural heritage also from a creative engagement and application in art and writing.

Traditional and modern techniques in art production (like cave paintings with coal from stone age as well as modern art installations, lyrics as well as poetry slam) will be practised to discover the possibilities of creating art and writing tales in progress. One end product is a huge panoramic picture in Austria with all the pictures and stories artistically processed and illustrated and a second end product is a booklet with all our writings, lyrics and poetry, our new tales and our new mythology. To develop together basic skills in art history, mythology, art expression, expression in lyric and poetry, writing tales, art design will be a challenge and a opportunity, to practise alternativ and new methods in teamworking.

The project aims at developing students' critical thinking about the European origin and European development, understanding for European heritage, the beginning of European art, tales, mythology, history in art, creativity and the basic ability of justifing their opinions. Art will be taken as a starting point to raise and discuss European issues as well as a form to express opinions, ideas, feelings.

The project aims that students are familiar with the European history in art and in tales and in mythology and acquires skills in creating art and writing tales.

The integrative effect of art will contribute to a better understanding of cultures. Our twin-space activities, surveys, cultural topics and questionnaires, mobilities, exchanges on the project website, Google, Facebook & Skype meetings will teach our pupils a lot about different cultures.

DEVELOPING THE INVOLVEMENT OF PUPILS AND TEACHERS

We aim an active participation of all students in the project via questionnaires, twin-space tasks, competitions, searching activities, mind maps and discussions.

We want to help our teachers exchange pedagogical methods with European colleagues. 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Description of the activity:

- Describe the content, methodology and expected results of the activity.
- How is it going to be related to or integrated with the normal activities of the involved schools?

This project will give an opportunity for students and teachers to explore and relive the traditions of the ancient Samnite people whose history was born in Molise.

There will be a preliminary visit to the Samnitic Museum in the historical center of Campobasso. The Samnite provincial museum has been open since 1995. It exhibits finds from the territory of the ancient Sannio, ranging from late prehistory to the Middle Ages. The museum relives the aspects of daily life, rites and beliefs of a people that for a long time opposed the rule of Rome in Italy. The cult of Hercules, practiced in mountain sanctuaries, is testified by numerous bronze votive statuettes. The offerings in the treasures, rich in ceramics, terracotta and jewels, reflect the devotion of the Samnites and the Samnites. After this visits the students could create a workshop to restore original pieces of the museum to verify the workmanship of ancient artifacts and understand the importance of sources and archaeological finds; know and understand the concept of use and the important function of the museum; know and understand the concept of conservation; to know the figure of Hercules and his link with the territory of Molise develop sensitivity towards the national historical and archaeological heritage and the ability to rationalize the sense of time and space; encourage teamwork and encourage creativity. The new teaching methodologies such as cooperative learning, doing by doing and problem solving can be used in the laboratory activities that will take place in the museum. These methodology have always been used in our school because the laboratory activities are essential to prepare students for entry into the world of work. The project also includes a visit to the historic center of the city of Campobasso where the partners will know the legend of King Bove and the birth of the churches of the city. After the visit, they will realize a Digital Storytelling, combining manual activities, such as the reproduction of archaeological finds with digital skills in the realization of the story of a legendary experience. Will be so developed the skills for planning, organizing, communication, activity, presentation of results, skills for teamwork. The visit to Altilia, a small Samnite city similar to Pompei, will bring students and teachers into an enchanted world where they can live the experiences of Samnite citizens in the ancient forum, in the theater, in the baths and on the streets, among the shops, as real citizens of another time. Then in the school's laboratories, the students will be able to make objects for Samnite citizens, for example work tools, jewelry, tools, but in a different way from the manual work carried out at the Samnite Museum. Infact after that they having drawn and reported through a 3D modeling program, they will be able to realize the chosen object through the 3D printer. This work will develop in the student digital skills, creativity, curiosity.

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How is participation in this activity going to benefit the involved participants?

The students will be more familiar with local traditions. They will broaden their horizons through the direct knowledge of different cultures and lifestyles. They will have the opportunity to host students from other countries and show them where they live, their habits, traditions and their culture. They will improve their social skills by working in groups with mixed skills and by understanding what it means to work to achieve a goal within a project that involves the construction of a final product. In addition, they will improve their study skills and motivation to study as they will work on a multidisciplinary project that involves the formation of groups at both a national and international level. In addition to communicative skills, they will then enhance their computer skills. They will understand how important it is to learn foreign languages and communicate in a common language, as English will be the language of the project and the only tool to communicate with partners. Not at least from the activities the students will develop communication and conflict management skills; leadership skills; listenings skills; problem solving; interpersonal and social competence such as tolerance, sense of responsibility, ability for compromise.

The above mentioned methods improve students creativity, problem solving skills, cooperation. The expected results of the project will be enhancement of digital competence in movie making (How light and darkness symbols appear in different cultures? - short film making activity), presentation (Representations of celestial bodies in different culture); interpersonal, intercultural and social competence: tolerance, individual and collective sense of responsibility, ability for compromise, constructive communication, sympathy, respect of each other.

The heterogeneity of our international project-team will give them a chance to provide their cultural competence such as music and dance, literature and history.

- How is it going to be related to or integrated with the normal activities of the involved schools?

We tailored the activities and methods according to the objectives of the project. In our institute the methodological guidance and quality management are important principles throughout the project period.

Team work, cooperative methods and an attitude for sophisticated work ethics are supposed to prevail in our activities. We plan to select students and collegues according to different needs of each learning, teaching and training activities (good linguistic skills, drawing skill, social abilities). We apply student-centered teaching methods like teamwork (international groups, competition), cooperative learning within the heterogeneous groups (differences in age, interest, skills, abilities), project work. Experience-based education (Ancient Hungarian ceremony around the campfire), the technical (build a huge zoetrope) and manual activities (produce national totems statuette; make Hungarian embroidery) that we prefer and promote will be hopefully effective methods for the students. Game-based (design a board game based on the mixture of international elements of tales, decryption game) and inquiry-based learning (similarities and differences in the motifs) and hands-on (typical national rhythms)projects are especially suitable for overcoming linguistic difficulties. Preceeding the meetings participating students will be charged with preparatory homework on international level which they have to perform as presentations or demonstrations (write and illustrate hungarian fairy tale using the given typipcal motifs).

The above mentioned methods improve students creativity, problem solving skills, cooperation. The expected results of the project will be enhancement of digital competence in movie making (How light and darkness symbols appear in different cultures? - short film making activity), presentation (Representations of celestial bodies in different culture); interpersonal, intercultural and social competence: tolerance, individual and collective sense of responsibility, ability for compromise, constructive communication, sympathy, respect of each other. Competence to take initiative will also be challenged: skills for planning, organizing, communication, activity, presentation of results, skills for teamwork.

The heterogeneity of our international project-team will give them a chance to provide their cultural competence such as music and dance, literature and history.

Description of the activity:

- Describe the content, methodology and expected results of the activity.
- How is it going to be related to or integrated with the normal activities of the involved schools?

We will organize a ceramics workshop at our school. Following the history of decorative motifs from the traditional Romanian art, that are going back to the Neolithic period. Some common motifs are the tree of life, the bypass, the sun, the star, the rope and the winery. The majority of the motifs are related to nature, this will be the bridge between the archaic world and the contemporary one.

The sculpture and ceramics department at Arts College in Arad has 4 studios where pupils learn the basics of modelling in clay and to create 3D works of art using various materials. There are also one ceramics oven and 3 potter's wheels. The workshop proposed for the project aims to familiarize pupils with traditional pottery making and also clay modeling having as starting point archaic and folk art and pottery. For research purpose pupils will visit art and history museums in the region like Museum Complex Arad, National Museum of Banat in Timisoara / Department of Archeology - Neolithic sanctuary from Parţa, fully restored. In the shrine room there is a parallelepiped shaped pedestal, made of clay, from 6,000 years ago. Sanctuary from Parţa is reconstituted close to scale, being unique in Europe. Part of the research is also the archeological site Sarmizegetusa Regia. Additionally they will visit and work at the Arad County Library that has a prestigious collection of old books, they will discover the monograms in hand painted books, that use similar decorative motifs.

The methodology consist of making a research by visiting museums and studying local history, making sketches, comparing different knowledge in the group about traditional decorative motifs, discussing discoveries made during the research, creating works of ceramic art, creating stories with monograms. By adapting the traditional motifs from art to contemporary stories related to ecology, pupils will create short stories about the contemporary world.

Expected results are the accumulated knowledge of local history, the works of ceramic art created, the ability working with clay, the connections between the pupils own knowledge and the acquired new ones, the creation of suggestive stories addressing contemporary issues inspired be local myths and decorative motifs, the raised awareness of the way in which the archaic decorative motifs have perpetuated until our times. The activities will be integrated in the sculpture and ceramics department of the school.

As a way of teaching volume, one of the 3 main fundamental disciplines for studying art along with color and drawing, pupils start with the basics, starting with play and continuing with elaborated study from nature. All art elaborated study is based on modernist art, and study of form in art. For this project we hope to look into primitive and archaic art and find its connection with modern and contemporary art using art history and storytelling for discovering the connection between our world and the lost worlds of Europe.

How is participation in this activity going to benefit the involved participants?

Benefits are related to studying art and ceramic art in a specialized art high school, the cultural knowledge won through the activities, the discovery of the common historical backgrounds and the common values shared by participants.

European ART & TALES in progress (ART & TALES)

Once upon a time there were ancient civilisations in EUROPE – paintings in caves, sculptures in the stone age, Greek mythology about the origin of Europe, ...

Our project ART & TALES will be created by six European Countries with very old history in art, tales and mythology in Europe (for instance Spain with Altamira, Italy with Etrusce and Roman culture, very old caves in Bulgaria, sculptures from stone age in Austria - venus from Willendorf) and a lot of European cultural heritage, tales and mythology (Hungary, Romania,). Also in the project are 2 schools with focus in art (Romania and Italy) and schools with focus in history, writing and old languages (Greek and Latin). The project focuses on the beginning of European history and mythology in art, mythology and tales and acquires skills in creating art and writing tales - comparable to a huge picture book.

Traditional and modern techniques in art production (like cave paintings with coal from stone age as well as street art from Banksy or Michael Köhlmaier with modern tales as well as poetry slam and lyrics performances) will be practised to discover the possibilities of creating art and writing tales in progress. To our opinion comes the value and the understanding of the beginnings of European cultural heritage also from a creative engagement and application in art and writing. The end product is a huge panoramic picture in Austria (22 meters long, 2 meters high) with all the pictures and stories artistically processed (also during long term exchanges - artists in residence) and a booklet with all our writings, our tales, our new mythology. To develop together basic skills in art history, mythology, art expression, writing tales, art design will be a challenge and a opportunity, to practise alternativ and new methods in art expression, art development and teamworking.

The outside of the panoramic picture is in cooperation with partner schools in Africa, Asia and America a summery and comperision about Art&Tales in other parts of the world. The art association "Art & Development" will be the coordinator for the external associated partners (Ghana, Bosnia & Herzegowina, Armenia).

The project aims that students are familiar with the European history and mythology in art and acquire skills in creating art and writing tales. The value of European cultural heritage comes from the creative engagement and application in art and writing.

We will produce art pictures and writings on the subjects of European cultural heritage, history of art, European tales, European mythology.

We will analyse art and tales. We make a writing competition.

We make an initiation to Art history and mythology. We present a typology of tales and mythology.

A workshop about art, a workshop about literature, tales, mythology.

We will study some of the art pictures about mythology.

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We will organize workshops for writing tales. We try to create new tales. We try to perform our new mythology.

The pupils prepare the final presentation for all workshops, art pictures (huge panoramic picture) and tales (booklet) in Austria.
